

**CITY OF SCHULENBURG
SCHULENBURG, TX
April 20, 2026**

The City Council of the City of Schulenburg met in regular session on Monday, April 20, 2026, at 6:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers located at 607 Upton Avenue, Schulenburg, Texas. The elected officials present included Mayor, Connie Koopmann, Alderwoman, Kathy Kleiber, Aldermen, Greg Thomas, Frank Wick III, Roger Moellenberndt, and Clarence Ahlschlager. City staff present included City Administrator, Tami Walker, Public Works Director, Darryl Moeller, Police Officer, Byron Powe, and City Secretary, Mason Florus.

Visitors included Darrell Vyvjala of the Schulenburg Sticker, Drew Whittington and Wade Thompson with Government Capital Securities, Erin and Ryan Wotipka, Jeanine Ulrich, Michael Ohnheiser, and Eamon McCourt.

Mayor Koopmann called role. Mason Florus said a prayer over the meeting and its members. Mayor Koopmann led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge.

Alderman Wick made a motion, seconded by Alderman Thomas, to accept Consent Agenda Items A, B, and C. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Walker noted that the reserves are down about \$1.1 Million this quarter in relation to the 4th quarter of 2025. She cited the Civic Center and GLO monies coming in and out. Ms. Walker also announced that interest was down \$293.33.

Ms. Walker led discussion on a Resolution for a Parks Master Plan.

Ms. Walker announced that this is the final piece to Burditt's consulting services. This resolution is necessary to provide proof of a master plan to be eligible for grant funding.

Ms. Walker read the Resolution.

Alderwoman Kleiber made a motion, seconded by Alderman Ahlschlager, to accept the Resolution. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Walker led discussion on a Resolution for a Catalytic Converter Theft Prevention Grant.

Ms. Walker read the Resolution.

Alderman Moellenberndt made a motion, seconded by Alderman Thomas, to accept the Resolution. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Koopmann led discussion on a Resolution Authorizing Publication of Notice of Intention to Issue Certificates of Obligation, Series 2026 and Authorizing Certain Other Matters Relating Thereto.

Mayor Koopmann asked Drew Whittington and Wade Thompson with Government Capital Securities if the language says not to exceed \$15 million, after the forty-five days, the project can be down sized or the amount lessened. Mr. Whittington and Thompson answered yes.

Mayor Koopmann suggested to Council to pass the Resolution to get the process started and in the next forty-five days and several Council Meetings, Council can revisit the nuances of the projects and make changes if desired.

Alderwoman Kleiber made a motion, seconded by Alderman Thomas, to accept the Resolution. The motion failed 3-2 with Aldermen Wick, Moellenberndt, and Ahlschlager voting against, and Alderwoman Kleiber and Alderman Thomas voting for.

Under Mayor Comments, Mayor Koopmann wanted to congratulate the Chamber on a successful Sausagefest.

Public Works Director, Darryl Moeller's report was included in Council's Packets.

Moeller added that with the storms last Sunday, there were many outages and a number of down trees. He commended his guys for their teamwork and noted that City Crews hauled about 50 loads of limbs free of charge for citizens.

City Administrator, Tami Walker, reported the following to Council:

- Some of the Walking Trail at the Sports Complex was washed out with the storm. City Staff is pondering on making the whole trail concrete. Staff will request bids.
- LCRA Steps Forward did their community service painting handrails and the bridges at the Sports Complex Walking Trail. She thanked LCRA for their efforts.
- Council may see in the newspaper that sales tax is down. This time last year, the City's allotment was \$107,086.78. The City's latest funding was \$91,160.95.
- Monday, April 27th, Myself, Mason, Megan, Thadious, and Chief, will be in a virtual meeting with CivicPlus. The City already used CivicPlus' Archive Social for our Social Media records retention. This call is in reference to revamping the City Website and getting it ADA Compliant.
- The Schulenburg PD Sponsored Kid Fish is going on May 2nd from 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. Tom's BBQ is volunteering to grill hotdogs. At the time of this meeting, 35 kids are registered to participate.

Ms. Walker also noted that there is a misconception about the water well that was included in the certificate of obligation resolution. The City does not have an "urgent" need but the well casing at Henderson Hill is broken and those funds could have been used towards repair or drilling a new well on that existing site.

Alderman Moellenberndt professed to Mayor that he would like to see discussion of a new water well be on the next agenda. Staff answered that they will start gathering information.

Alderman Ahlschlager made a motion, seconded by Alderman Moellenberndt, to adjourn the meeting at 7:32. The motion passed unanimously.
